Let the Adventures Begin! Back to 1927

This column is dedicated to Dorothy Scott as she celebrates her 85th year. So, in honor of Dorothy's birth year, I thought it would be fun to bring about some interesting facts about that year.

On April 15th approximately 15 inches of rain falls within 18 hours, adding to the volume of high level in the Mississippi River causing the river to break the levee system in 145 locations. The Great Mississippi Flood affected 27,000 square miles, 10 states and over 700,000 people. The worse state affected was Arkansas.

Striking miners from the Columbine Mine are massacred by machine gun fire from the state police in Serene Colorado. The police opened fire on 500 rowdy, but unarmed miners. At the time, miners had been on strike over a week at various mines within the state.

Charles Lindbergh flies *The Spirit of St. Louis* non-stop across the Atlantic Ocean from New York to Paris. This was the first transatlantic solo flight. The flight took off from Roosevelt Airfield at 6:52am EST on May 20th and arrived in Paris 33 hours, 29 minutes later.

On May 22^{nd} an earthquake measuring 8.6 on the Richter Scale hits Xining, China killing over 200,000 people.

In October, work began on Mt. Rushmore and the carving of four presidents, Washington, Jefferson, Lincoln & T. Roosevelt in the smooth fine-grained granite of the Black Hills in South Dakota.

The Holland Tunnel opened on November 13th connecting NYC with New Jersey. The tunnel which was the first structure constructed under the Hudson River and is named after Chief Engineer Clifford Milburn Holland. Construction began in March of 1922 at the corner of Canal and West Streets.

Pan American Airway is formed.

1st Transatlantic phone call from NYC to London is made.

Ford ceases manufacturing the Model T after selling 15 million cars, and begins selling the Model A with various body styles.
